


Portfolio Commentary

The global market increased significantly during the month of December in local currency terms by 5.66%, whilst the AUD appreciated significantly against major global currencies for the month (6.73%, 6.40%, 3.49% and 3.48% against the US dollar, British pound, Euro and the Yen respectively), resulting in a return of 0.44% for the index in Australian dollar terms.

The Fund delivered -2.27% for the month and 2.41% for the 12 months to December, underperforming the benchmark by -2.71% for the month but outperforming the benchmark by 4.36% over the year. During the month, the Fund benefitted from gains in Wells Fargo, US Bancorp, Lowe's, Google, Procter & Gamble and Kraft Foods (appreciating 13.89%, 13.62%, 10.48%, 6.88%, 5.34% & 5.12% in local currency respectively).

The Fund continues to take advantage of the relatively strong AUD by deploying cash and inflows into investee companies at prices below our assessed intrinsic value.
